	"Australia in Palestine", 1919, Published by Angus & Robertson LTD., Sydney, 1919, Printed by W.C. Penfold & Co. Ltd. Edited by HS Gullett and Chas. Barrett, with David Barker as the Art Editor. The book is merely a Soldiers' Book, produced almost entirely by soldiers in the field under active service conditions. 153 pages, this book includes 20 coloured plate illustrations and 36 photographs, etc. What makes this copy so rare however, is its dust wrapper, a press notice titled "Just Out, Australia in Palestine". The press notice spans over both the front and back of the dust wrapper. Book is of hardbound leather covers in very good condition. Specifications: 27.2 x 22.51cm.

	Austen, Jane. 6 Novels in 5 Volumes. Published, London: Richard Bentley, 1833. Important first collected and first illustrated edition of the novels of Jane Austen, printed from the plates of Bentley's "Standard Novel" editions of 1833, each volume with engraved frontispiece illustration and vignette title page, finely bound. Small octavo, wine red calf skin half covers with gilt-lettering on spine. Pride and Prejudice has cover loose, Sense and Sensibility is missing front cover. Mansfield Park & Emma have been rebound, boasting half modern blue calf covers plus marbling, raised bands, morocco burgundy spine labels, gilt-lettering to spine.

9	Plans of Sydney - H. Percy Dove DOVE, Percy. Atlas of the City of Sydney. Sydney: John Sands, c. 1880. Imperial Elephant Folio (56 x 40 cm). Neatly rebound, retaining gilt-titled cover. Comprising double-page index map with explanatory key, followed by 120 hand-coloured lithographic plans on 47 double pages. Two additional sheets containing 32 separate detailed building plans related to the prior 120. Map covering city of Sydney, showing streets and parklands, etc. Each plan details streets, lanes, buildings, shops and wharves of the city centre, surveyed block by block at a scale of 40 feet to 1 inch. Buildings are distinguished by construction material (pink for brick/stone, yellow for wood, blue for iron), number of storeys (circled numerals), and roof type (shingle noted "SH", otherwise slate or metal). Sheets are numbered in consecutive sets (e.g. 1,2,3,4), each sheet comprising several adjoining plans. Light foxing throughout. First Edition. Extremely rare. Produced by licensed surveyor H. Percy Dove between 1879 and 1881, these were the first fire-insurance plans of Sydney's city centre, utilised by insurance companies, solicitors, surveyors, and government departments including Public Works and the City Improvement Board. Note from previous owner details acquisition of the copy, and the original owners being Walker Brothers Real Estate Agents and Valuers and hence some markings have been made throughout i.e., sales markings, etc.
10	Loring's Nine and Half Inch Terrestrial Globe
	Drawn and engraved by W. B. Annin. Boston: Josiah Loring, c.1845. Terrestrial globe, 9½ inches in diameter, with engraved gores and polar calottes, original hand colouring over papier mâché base; brass meridian ring, movable polar arrow, engraved paper horizon ring with zodiac on wood, supported on original cherry wood stand. Fine condition with warm patina, minor age discolouration, and recent conservation lacquer. Depicts Weddell's 1823 Antarctic voyage, Wilkes' discoveries from the U.S. Exploring Expedition (1838–42), Cook's death site on Hawaii, "Russian America" for Alaska, and distinctive misspellings such as "Hong Kiang." Interior of New Zealand labelled "Eahei Nomaewe" and "Tovai Poen Amoo." Loring, Boston's first commercial globe maker, issued his first globe in 1832; his gores were engraved by William B. Annin after C. Smith & Son, London. After 1837 he was assisted by Gilman Joslin. Globes of this period and preservation are rare on the market.
